## What is St. Paul's Called to Be?

You may have noticed our financial statements over the past couple of years which we have published in the Apostle, or heard at our Annual Meetings. St. Paul's has been operating in the red. We are able to meet our operating budget only by dipping into our endowment – an unsustainable situation! By our calculations, our endowment will be gone in about five years, and then St. Paul's as a church will have to change drastically or cease to exist. That is the bad news.

The good news is – we have five whole years to solve this problem!

And oddly, the problem isn't money. Our financial crisis is only a symptom of a larger problem, a problem that is larger than St. Paul's, larger than the Episcopal Church. Churches of all denominations are losing members, even the "mega" churches. The problem for us is the changing nature of our society. We simply are becoming an increasingly secular country. Young people leave and don't come back to church. People want to be "spiritual, but not religious". The media only publishes the most garish and depraved stories about religion, the ones that sell, and people come to believe that religion is a place of judgmental, self-righteous, angry, selfish people, and our clergy are all corrupt. Now granted all churches, including St. Paul's are imperfect, but that other characterization bears no resemblance to the kind, self-sacrificing, compassionate, loving people I find in our pews. There is a disconnect in society's mind between what they believe Christianity is about, and what it is REALLY is about. And we bear some of the blame too.

Others believe worship is boring and irrelevant. If it is boring, then we need to change. If we come across as irrelevant, then we have a marketing problem. Others believe Christianity is

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about being a moral person and being “nice”, and since they can do that on their own, why go to church? Still others believe we are about perpetuating an institution and not about the loving gospel of Jesus Christ. Perhaps some in our pews believe this one too.

As I once wrote here before, **Christianity is not about morality. Christianity is about God. Christianity is about being a revolutionary to heal a broken world.**

And yet humans are created to be spiritual beings. So many of these people who are not going to church are floundering. Some may find their way to a different religion, which is fine. But many, who also live here in North Andover, simply set aside that part of themselves, feeling a dull ache that something is missing in their lives, but having no capacity to fill that God-shaped hole in their hearts. And yet we can help them! And they can help us! But they will never step foot in our door, and it would never occur to them that we have something to offer. Or maybe how we offer it needs to change. Or maybe they have something to offer us that we need, which we don't even know about yet, which will cause us to change. And perhaps that change will be painful, but of God.

So the question isn't “How do we balance the budget?” but “What is God calling St. Paul's to be in light of our society's changing paradigm?”. If we can answer that question, if we are doing God's will, the money will come as it is needed.

To help us answer that question, St. Paul's is creating a Strategic Planning Committee Chaired by Loren Carlson. And we need all of you to help us in this endeavor. All of you will be asked to participate in some of our conversations to help us discern where the Holy Spirit is leading us. You will be hearing more about this in the weeks and months to come. Please keep us in your prayers.

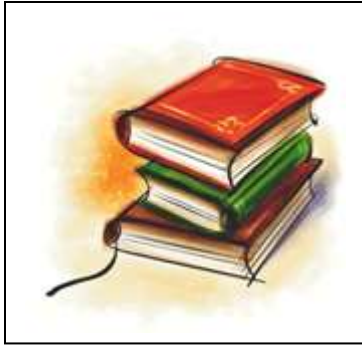

## **St. Paul's Women's Book Group**

The Women's Book Group will meet Thursday, September 16<sup>th</sup>,

at 7:00 p.m. in the French Memorial to discuss Three Cups of Tea (non-fiction) by Greg Mortenson and David Oliver Relin.

**A review from "Bookmarks Magazine":** While critics agree that Three Cups of Tea should be read for its inspirational value rather than for its literary merit, the book's central theme, derived from a Baltistan proverb, rings loud and clear. "The first time you share tea with a Balti, you are a stranger," a villager tells Greg Mortenson. "The second time, you are an honored guest. The third time you become family." An inspirational story of one man's efforts to address poverty, educate girls, and overcome cultural divides, Three Cups of Tea, which won the 2007 Kiriya Prize for nonfiction, reveals the enormous obstacles inherent in becoming such "family." Despite the important message, critics quibbled over the awkward prose and some melodrama. After all, a story as dramatic and satisfying as this should tell itself.

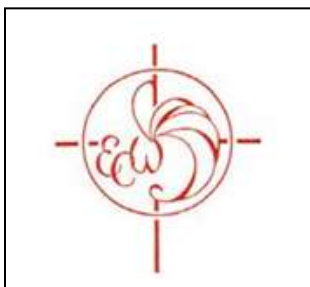

## Finance Committee News

The revenue and expense for July and the first seven months appear below.

Both receipts and disbursements were low during the month but disbursements exceeded receipts by \$4,000. For the first time in 2010 we transferred money from our investments accounts to fund cash flow.

We anticipate the deficit for the year ending 12/31/2010 will be just under \$50,000. That means a total transfer of \$50,000 from endowment will be needed to fund the year. As we begin the process of budgeting for 2011 we are considering just what a balanced budget for St. Paul's would look like. We welcome your thoughts and concerns.

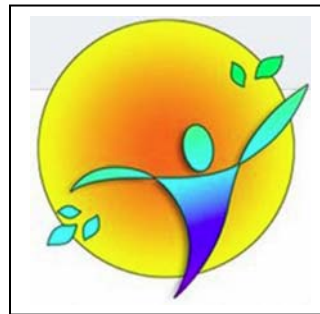
